Lewis and Clark led the Corps of Discovery from 1803-1806. The goals of the expedition were to map the newly acquired territory of the western half of the continent and to make known amongst the natives the expedition led by Lewis and Clark.



### SACAGAWEA

Sacagawea, a Shoshone woman from Lemhi County, Idaho, helped Lewis and Clark with their expedition. Though Meriwether Lewis had a somewhat negative view of her, William Clark had a high regard for her.

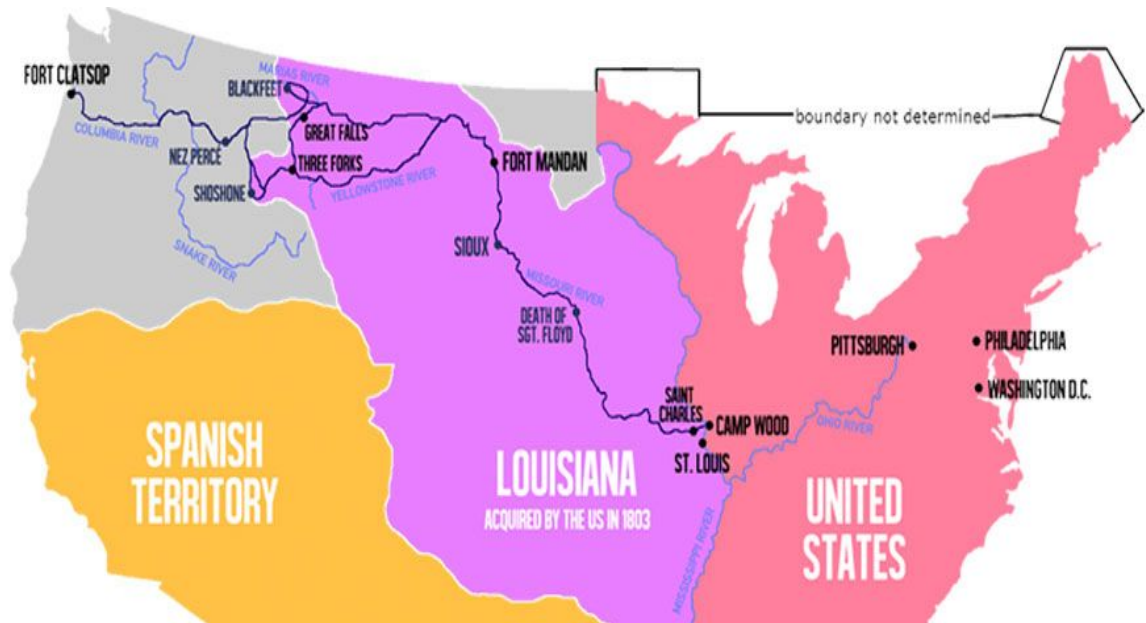

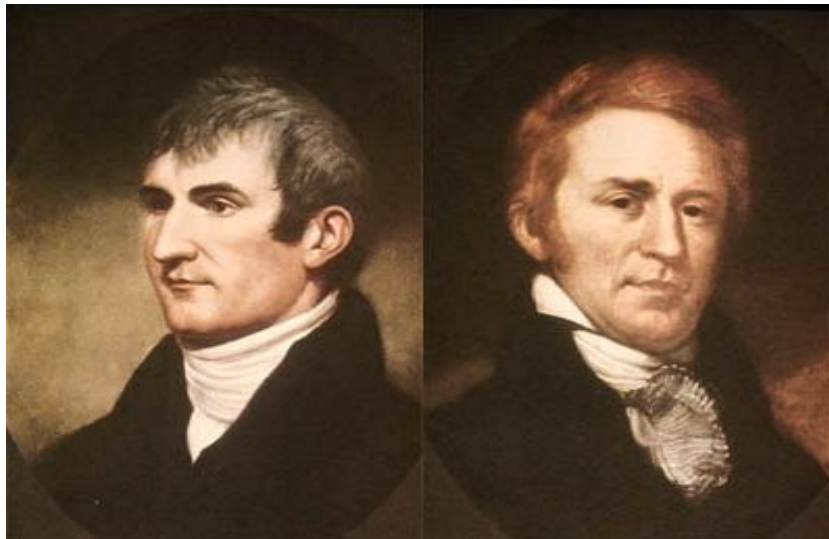

Meriwether Lewis and William Clark were American explorers famous for taking the first American expedition to cross what is now the western portion of the United States, departing in May 1804, from near St. Louis on the Mississippi River, making their way westward through the continental divide to the Pacific coast.



# MERIWETHER LEWIS FACTS

**Name:** Meriwether Lewis

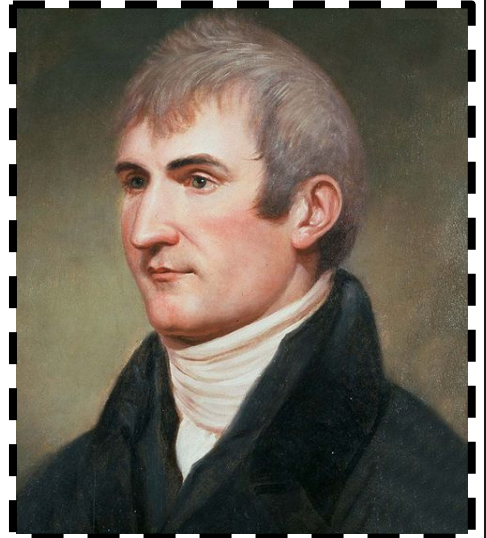
**Date of Birth:** August 18, 1774

**Date of Death:** October 11, 1809

**Place of Birth:** Virginia

**Birth Family:** Lt. William Lewis  
and Lucy Meriwether

**Marriage/Spouse:** Never Married



**Education:** Educated by private tutors. He graduated from Liberty Hall (now Washington and Lee University).

**Career:** American explorer, soldier and politician

**Reason for Fame:** Lewis and Clark Expedition of 1803 to 1805 across the Louisiana Purchase to the Pacific Ocean.

**Additional Information:** For many years, Lewis' legacy was overlooked, inaccurately assessed, and even tarnished by his alleged suicide. Yet his contributions to science, the exploration of the Western U.S. and the lore of great world explorers, are considered incalculable.

# WILLIAM CLARK FACTS

**Name:** William Clark

**Date of Birth:** August 1, 1770

**Date of Death:** September 1, 1838

**Place of Birth:** Virginia

**Birth Family:** John and Ann  
Rogers Clark

**Marriage/Spouses:** First wife was

Julia Hancock. Second wife was Harriet Kennerly Radford

**Children:** Clark had five children from his first wife: Meriwether Lewis Clark, Sr. (named after his friend, Meriwether Lewis); William Preston Clark; Mary Margaret Clark, George Rogers Hancock Clark and John Julius Clark. After his wife's death in 1920, he married her first cousin, Harriet Kennerly Radford and they had three children: Jefferson Kearny Clark, Edmund Clark and Harriet Clark.

**Education:** No formal education; tutored at home



# WILLIAM CLARK FACTS

**Career:** American explorer, soldier, Indian agent and territorial governor

**Reason for Fame:** Lewis and Clark Expedition of 1803 to 1805 across the Louisiana Purchase to the Pacific Ocean.

**Additional Information:** In 2001, President Bill Clinton posthumously increased Clark's US Army rank to Captain.
